

Playwright's Note

This play is not about slavery.

NORTH is an exploration of the multifaceted, dynamic and complicated lives of Black folks in early American history. NORTH is a work of fiction, based on the experiences of real people like you and me, each of them unique in their strengths and challenges. NORTH is about grit, community, and finding magic in the most unexpected places.

The inspiration for *NORTH* began with my first trip to Vacherie, Louisiana - the home of my maternal ancestors, as far back as I can trace. Since then, my ancestors have played an active role in the development of this piece, daring me to tell the colorful story of Black life during the antebellum period, which covers a full range of experiences. I decided to tell this story by developing a theatrical experience for intergenerational audiences, allowing people to step into the world of people before us - and find something familiar.

I have often said that my favorite part about *NORTH* is the conversations that it sparks, especially the ones that challenge me. My greatest hope is that this work inspires curiosity, wonder, and conversations for you too. I made this for all of us, for our children, and our collective ancestors whose stories deserve to be told. Their lives were more than a line item on a bill of sale.




