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



THE RIGHTEOUS BROTHERS BILL MEDLEY & BUCKY HEARD



SATURDAY, JANUARY 20, 2024 | 7:30 P.M.

Blue-eyed soul pioneers **The Righteous Brothers** are back! With a string of #1 classics, including the most played song in radio history, "You've Lost That Lovin' Feelin'," the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame duo of Bill Medley and Bobby Hatfield topped the charts in four decades. After Bobby's death in 2003, Bill Medley continued to perform to sold-out crowds around the world, but fans and friends pleaded with him to keep The Righteous Brothers alive. Says Medley "... No one could ever take Bobby's place, but when I caught Bucky Heard's show it all came together – I found the right guy to help me recreate the magic." The concert experience features their biggest hits – "Lovin' Feelin'," "Soul & Inspiration," "Unchained Melody," "Rock and Roll Heaven," "Medley's GRAMMY®-winning Dirty Dancing theme "The Time of My Life," and much, much more!

The Bill Medley/Bucky Heard pairing came as something of a happy accident. Medley says it just seemed right. "I'd been friends with Bucky for years, but when I caught his show he just killed me! The next day it hit methat's the guy, someone I could sing hard with, laugh hard with, love and respect - on and off stage. He fits **The Righteous Brothers** live performance show perfectly. And, we've even recorded some new material together, I'm really excited!"

Bill Medley is truly one of the iconic figures in American music history. His instantly recognizable baritone voice has anchored some of the biggest recordings of all time. He's won a GRAMMY®, an Oscar, a Golden Globe, and an American Music Award.

The Orange County, California native began writing songs as a boy and had his breakout as a songwriter and singer when, in 1963, the Medley-penned "Little Latin Lupe Lu" became a regional hit for Bill and Bobby Hatfield, as their first release as The Righteous Brothers. Other regional hits followed, "Justine," "Koko Joe," and "My Babe," which led to a regular spot on ABC-TV's national Shindig! broadcast. The show, featuring a cast of regulars, along with quest stars every week, catered to the teen audience, something new for TV at that time. Shindig!'s smash success coincided with The Righteous Brothers opening for both The Beatles and The Rolling Stones on their first US tours

Soon, The Righteous Brothers caught producer Phil Spector's attention and he signed them to record what would become, according to BMI, the most played song in the history of American radio – the Barry Mann/Cynthia Weil classic, "You've Lost That Lovin' Feelin'." A string of top hits followed until 1968 when Medley and Hatfield agreed to part ways to pursue solo efforts. Medley soon scored with top ten hits, "Peace, Brother, Peace" and "Brown-Eyed Woman." In 1974, Bill and Bobby re-united and within a few weeks had yet another monster hit with "Rock and Roll Heaven."

From then, until Bobby's passing in 2003, The Righteous Brothers never stopped performing to packed crowds. During that period Bill also recorded the chart-topping duet with Jennifer Warnes, "The Time of My Life," for the movie *Dirty Dancing*. It went on to sell over 32 million copies worldwide. Then, shortly before Bobby passed away, in 2003 Righteous Brothers fan Billy Joel inducted the pair into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame with a glowing seven-minute speech.

Always active and stretching his creative talents, Medley has also sung on the soundtracks or performed the theme songs for 33 movies and TV shows and, in 2014, released his memoir, *The Time of My Life*, published by Da Capo Press.

Bucky Heard, an Alabama native and Auburn University alum, is one of the most popular and versatile performers in America. For several years, he has headlined countless shows in major venues. His reputation as a gutsy rock and roll singer with an incredible vocal range has garnered much critical praise and a legion of fans.

He's been hand-selected to share the concert stage with legends like Andy Williams and Glen Campbell, and honored as "Male Vocalist of the Year" by entertainment publications. Credited with being one of the hardest working and in-demand performers, Bucky has rocked his way across America with his 10-piece horn band, and also starred in numerous national production shows.

Multi-talented and always seeking to expand his musical horizons, he recently created, wrote, and produced an original children's musical variety show called *Rock U Mentally*, which headlined the American Bandstand Theatre for two consecutive summers

Heard says teaming with Bill Medley in The Righteous Brothers has been a wonderful gift. "Performing with Bill Medley is like getting your PhD in show business! He is more than a legend; he puts everything into every performance, and really understands how to connect with an audience. He motivates me to be my best and I'm so grateful for this opportunity!"

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

What is new about NORTH this year?

This time around, we're exploring new ways to let the props, blocking and costuming support the storytelling. To achieve this, our focus is on incorporating materials and theatrical conventions from the time period of the story (mid-1800s). Think antique gardening tools, shadow play, and the tradition of Bouffon clowns. It's wild -- and really exciting!

How has NORTH progressed since you started out?

Now that we've seen the show on its feet. we understand the relationships between the characters. This allows us to identify what aspects are functioning effectively and what elements require modification in order to enhance the overall narrative. The phrase we continue to ask ourselves is. "Has this been earned?"

Were there any unforeseen difficulties between creating NORTH and seeing it through to production? What about triumphs?

Our biggest challenge has been budget! I'm a big dreamer, and those dreams don't always fit neatly into spreadsheets. Lucky for me I have an incredible creative team that always finds ways to turn these dreams into reality. And actually, building this creative team - which is really a family now

- has been the greatest triumph of this show. I'm so proud of what we've created.

What is or has been your favorite part about being a performing artist?

I never forget how blessed I am to wake up every day and create whatever I want. I still can't believe that people want to hear what I have to say. I don't take that lightly.

What musicians/bands are you listening to right now?

I'm listening to a lot of neo-folk and neosoul as of late: Alabama Shakes, Brandi Carlile, Lucius, and Emily King, to name a

Best concert or performance you've been to?

The musical Fela! kind of changed me. It's this immersive play, concert, and storytelling event, all rolled into one served on a bed of Afrobeat. It really expanded my understanding of what is possible in theater.

If you could live anywhere in the world, where would it be and why?

Portugal. They've got it all: history and arts, amazing food, beaches, forests, hip cities, ancient villages, diversity, rich queer culture, free health care, affordability, and loads of castles. CASTLES! It's just magical.

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THE PEKING ACROBATS



SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 4, 2024 | 3:00 P.M.

For the last thirty-two years, **THE PEKING ACROBATS®** have redefined audience perceptions of Chinese acrobatics. They perform daring maneuvers atop a precarious pagoda of chairs and display their technical prowess at such arts as trick-cycling, precision tumbling, juggling, somersaulting, and gymnastics. They push the limits of human ability, defying gravity with amazing displays of contortion, flexibility, and control. THE PEKING ACROBATS are often accompanied by live musicians who skillfully play traditional Chinese instruments; the time-honored Chinese music coalesces with high-tech special effects and awe-inspiring acrobatic feats to create an exuberant entertainment event with the festive pageantry of a Chinese carnival.

Since their founding in 1986, THE PEKING ACROBATS have been featured on numerous television shows and celebrity-studded TV specials. These include Nickelodeon's Unfabulous, Ellen's Really Big Show (hosted by Ellen DeGeneres), The Wayne Brady Show, That's Incredible, ABC's Wide World of Sports, and NBC's Ring In The New Year Holiday Special. They have also appeared on HDNet TV's In Focus series, and have appeared regularly in 3D on NBC/Comcast's new 3D Channel. THE PEKING ACROBATS set the world record for the Human Chair Stack on FOX Network's Guinness Book Primetime television show in 1999: they balanced six people precariously atop six chairs twenty-one feet up in the air without safety lines, astounding audiences with their bravery and dexterity. THE PEKING ACROBATS have also made their way onto the silver screen - company members were featured in Steven Soderbergh's hit film Ocean's Eleven, playing alongside Julia Roberts, Brad Pitt and George Clooney, PEKING ACROBATS' alumnus Shaobo Qin also appeared in that film's two sequels, Ocean's Twelve and Ocean's Thirteen.





Cynthia Dike-Hughes of The Peking Acrobats

Chandler Center for the Arts staff sent a Q & A to The Peking Acrobats President & CEO of 30 years, Cynthia A. Dike-Hughes. We wanted to know more about the show, her own preferences, and her take on the performing arts industry.

Can you tell us a little bit about how The Peking Acrobats started?

THE PEKING ACROBATS was the brainchild of my husband and business partner of over 40 years, Don Hughes, and his colleague at the time, Ken Hai. They formed a partnership in South Africa (SA), where Don was originally from. Ken was looking for a manager for his acrobatic group, and Don seized the opportunity to tour the show in SA and around the world. In 1986, they went to China and met with the then China Performing Arts Agency. and THE PEKING ACROBATS® were born. We bring different groups of acrobats from China each year to tour as THE PEKING ACROBATS, as many of the groups have obscure names that won't mean much to the Western audiences. Thanks to our work over these many years, THE PEKING ACROBATS has become synonymous with excellence in the traditional art of Chinese Acrobatics and this is what your audiences will see at your performances.

Tell us a little about the acrobats' training?

The acrobats begin training at a very young age. They attend specialized schools that

are the equivalent to our magnet schools here in the West. Often, they are the children of acrobats who have gone before them. They learn their 3 "Rs" in the morning (reading, writing and arithmetic) and train at their craft in the afternoons. They become adults at the age of 16 in China, and so are able to tour the world, sharing their art and culture with audiences everywhere.

What do you think is surprising about performing as an acrobat that people don't usually know?

They are NOT elastic people! They are just like you and me, but are specially trained in the acrobatic arts that is a unification of the body and the spirit. They elevate their cultural tradition through innovation and ingenuity. Each act takes years to perfect and they have a great time doing it!

What is your favorite thing about the performance?

I think for the performers it is the sheer transference of joy between the artists and the audience. You can't get that from a movie, or the internet. It's the actual moments of astonishment in live performance, that anything can happen (and, often does!) that makes the theatre so compelling. When we experience those moments together, that intangible is so rewarding and it truly is the secret to our success!

If you weren't in the performing arts industry, what other profession would you want to have?

I don't think the performers would live any other way. They get to travel the world, see other cultures and meet great people. I've been a theatre producer for almost 40 years, and it really is a fantastic way of life, if you don't weaken...as my Don used to say! HA!


If you could live anywhere in the world, where would it be and why?

Be persistent. Don't give up on your dreams. Sometimes, it may seem like it's too hard, or too tough, but you have to believe in what you are doing and why you are doing it. I can't think of a better way.
